Twiiellenmeier Award

The Twiiellenmeier Award is named in honor of the late Claude Twiiellenmeier, a founding father and Past President of AWI (1957-1958).

Presented by the Architectural Woodwork Institute, this prestigious award recognizes an AWI chapter president or past president who had exhibited superior leadership and service to the chapter, AWI and the woodworking industry.

Criteria for Twiiellenmeier Award nomination:

To be eligible for the Twiiellenmeier Award, nominees must meet the following criteria:

- Be a current or immediate past president of the chapter
- Have made significant and measurable contributions to both the chapter and AWI's membership development
- Have initiated and lead innovative programming, leadership and governance during his or her tenure as chapter president

How to submit a Twiiellenmeier Award Entry

Chapter officers or a designated representative may submit nominations.

Entries should include the following information:

1. A completed copy of the Twiiellenmeier Award Nomination Form, signed by the both the individual that prepared the entry and one member of the chapter's board of directors.
2. Copies of reports, brochures or other chapter samples that support the nomination.

Completed nomination forms must received at the AWI National office no later than Auguts 1st of each year.

Judging:

- The AWI Chapter Development Committe votes to select a recipient and recognition of his/her chapter after completing a thorough review of nominees' forms and criteria.
- The Chapter Development Committee recommends the final prospective recipient to the AWI Board of Directors for their vote and approval.
- The final recipient is presented with a beautiful plaque while his/her chapter receives a monetary award of \$150. The Twiiellenmeier Award presentation is made at the Annual Meeting/Convention.
