### Questions for Conversation #1

- How would you describe the food of your culture? What is the most popular food?
- What holidays do you celebrate? What do they represent?
- How would you describe traditional clothing in your culture?
- How do people in your culture greet one another? Is it more formal or direct/casual?
- What hobbies, activities, or sports do you enjoy?
- How many languages do you speak? What challenges, if any, have you had in learning these languages?
- If you had to pick one cultural value that is the most important to you, what would it be?
- What are your personal goals and aspirations? How does your culture affect these?

### Questions for Conversation #2

- What is your country's predominant religion? What are some common celebrations demonstrated in this religion?
- What behaviors were expected of you growing up? Are they the same for young people now?
- How is education different for you now as compared to when you were young? How is education viewed in your culture? Is it a standard to have a college degree? Is a college education an option for most?
- How important is being on time to you?
- In what ways are emotions shown, or not, in your culture?
- How would you describe a positive work ethic? Do you prioritize finishing work before personal matters like family gatherings, or do you prioritize personal matters?
- How would your culture describe personal beauty?
- What do you consider to be "personal space?" How often do you have physical contact (during greetings or conversation) throughout the day?

### Questions for Conversation #3

- What are the typical roles expected of different family members?
- How would you describe being polite in your culture? How important is this to you?
- Is there a certain age when people begin to get jobs? Who is expected to work outside of the home?
- What are some examples of nonverbal body language that are important to know in your culture?
- What types of freedoms and restrictions do you experience in your culture? How are these different than in the United States?
- How does your culture view the current social justice movements, like Black Lives Matter?
- Who holds the most power and authority in your culture?
